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Dear Friends,

We are proud to present you with the annual report for 2012.

This year, we experienced a sharp transition from routine to emergency mode. During Operation "Operation Pillar of Defense", in November 2012, thousands of people from southern Israel have turned to us for psychological help. This was also the first time in over 20 years (since the Gulf War) that residents of central metropolitan areas such as Tel Aviv and Jerusalem had to live under constant rocket threat from the Gaza strip. NATAL's mental health professionals and volunteers worked around the clock for over a month in order to cater to the immense need during that critical period and many people continue to turn to us for emotional support and assistance.

The Community Outreach Unit worked in emergency mode in southern residential areas of Israel, and helped families living under the ongoing security threat including those who suffered from rocket attacks for the first time in areas previously unaffected.

Over 3,000 children in southern Israel saw the play "Kuntz and the Magic Mirror", a therapeutic children's puppet show specifically created by NATAL to strengthen the mental coping resources of children. The children's puppet show is part of the work done by the Community Outreach Unit, to strengthen those living under continuous rocket attacks.

An average of 300 children and adults received professional one-on-one therapy at NATAL's Clinical Unit per week and the Testimonial Center recorded over 100 testimonials from those who went through traumatic events in the Israeli war of Independence up to the Second Lebanon war.

The Social Therapeutic Club continued to operate three groups consisting of members from the "NATAL Club" and the "National Insurance Club". A variety of group workshops and activities were provided including tours and performances.

This year we published the 13th edition of "About Feelings", NATAL's annual newspaper of which over one million copies were distributed in main Israeli newspapers. The title for this edition was "Trauma Touches Everyone". It focused on the circles that surround the victims of terror and war, such as the grandparents, friends and distant relatives, some of which are not officially recognized for suffering from PTSD.

A series of fundraising events were held this year aiming at different audiences. Amongst the events there was the annual golf tournament at Ga'ash Golf Club, our annual Women's event at the Kastiel showroom with a leading actress from "Hatufim" (equivalent of "Homeland") Yael Abecassis and Iris Shai, the wife of the prisoner of war Hezi Shai, Dr. Rivka Tuval Mashiah and facilitator Yael Dan. The 9 Lives rock band performed at Reading 3 in collaboration with Israeli singer Jeremy Kaplan. Furthermore 9 Lives performed a series of concerts in collaboration with NATAL in academic institutions all across Israel with the aim of raising awareness to the issue of PTSD as a result of terror and war.

This year we completed the fifth cycle of a special program to train Casualty Notification Officers at the Multidisciplinary Trauma Studies Center. This program provides practical and emotional tools to help train the officers whose role is to support families dealing with loss and bereavement.

We would like to thank our friends and donors in Israel and all around the world.

With your help, we will continue to help those who need us.

Social Therapeutic Club

Head of Unit: Hagit Buchbinder

NATAL's Social Therapeutic Club enables the most traumatized victims of terror and war (who are often socially reclusive) to participate in meaningful social and therapeutic interactions. Housed in NATAL's Multidisciplinary Center in Tel Aviv, the club encompasses an entire floor of the building with a computer room, two art studios and a communal kitchen in which members cook meals and eat together. Within the club there are 7 group activities over the course of 5 days: Creativity workshops, leather workshops, movement, cooking, ceramics, painting, and music. In addition to these workshops that operate consistently, there are other activities such as trips, museum visits, watching theater performances, celebration of holidays and birthdays. Each class is taught by professionals in that specific field of interest. For our members, the club is an essential lifeline into the outside world and helps them regain a sense of normality and community. The club also hosts a group for the Ministry of Social Security.

Summary of activities in 2012

Continued strengthening of Club activities:

Club NATAL

During 2012 we continued to work diligently on strengthening the club and establishing club procedures (Every existing/new member is asked to accept the regulations). This is the second year in which we have provide yoga therapy to club members.

At the end of 2012, there were 23 members in the NATAL club with 6 different group activities taking place on 3 separate activity days. The activities included Feldenkreis, ceramics, cooking, painting, leatherwork, and Yoga. In addition, the "Orientation Club" continues to meet every week.

In total, the Social Therapeutic Club offers social activities to 50 members

National Insurance Club

During 2012, we continued to work on the stabilization of the club while also learning how to respond to the needs of this group's members.

The club operates 2 parallel groups on 2 activity days in the morning hours and enjoys different activities: Feldenkreis, Paper mache workshops, ceramics, and leather workshops.

At the same time, we are continuing the group meetings for members of the National Insurance Club, led by those responsible for NATAL's National Insurance Club and the NATAL's Club management. The frequency of these meetings is once per month for each group in the club. In the National Insurance Clubs, as of the end of 2012, there was a combined number of 27 members.



Multidisciplinary Trauma Studies Center

Head of Unit: Bina Levin

During times of emergency and crisis, Israel's population is exposed to severe psychological damage. Disastrous events such as terror attacks, wars, major accidents, physical violence or sexual abuse can result in damage to the individual, the family, groups and communities leading to the collapse of support systems and community services.

NATAL's Multidisciplinary Trauma Studies Center was established in 2007 with the aim of answering the growing need from mental health professionals who needed assistance when dealing with emotional stress and trauma as a result of emergencies. The Center provides comprehensive and multidisciplinary training in the field of trauma treatment on the theoretical and practical level.

The goals of the Multidisciplinary Trauma Studies Center

Training mental health professionals to treat emotional trauma and stress; Helping to increase public awareness of trauma as a result of terror and war; To serve as an expert knowledge center in the field of trauma

Summary of 2012 activities

In 2012 the Center continued the Casualty Notification Officers program.

The knowledge center and library expanded in collaboration with other units within NATAL.

Ongoing activities

The First Unit: Trauma-Focused Psychotherapy Studies

The school works in conjunction with the Sackler school of Medicine at Tel Aviv University.

In October 2012 the sixth year of studies started. The students included 30 professionals with backgrounds in the field of psychotherapy, consulting and rehabilitation.

Second Unit: Courses in the field of Therapy for Professionals

This course continued to provide:

Cognitive and behavioral intervention combined with biofeedback to treat anxiety; Course in EMDR stage 1+2 led by Dr. Udi Oren; Treatment of children suffering from anxiety and trauma led by Dina Sandrov; Intervention and treatment of trauma and loss in the elderly community; Art therapy workshops;

Course in treatment of trauma as a result of sexual abuse and incest led by Dr. Tzvia Zligman; Telephone intervention during emergencies at the Ministry of Absorption led by Sigal Haimov; Creative treatment of trauma led by Judy Gonen and Limor Sofer; In 2012 a total of over 100 mental health professionals took part in courses.

Expansion of the library

The library provides information to all who take an interest in the field of psychological trauma. A designated website constructed in 2010 continues provide a catalogue of all the titles, journals and articles in the field of trauma studies.

Training IDF Casualty Notification Officers

In October 2011 NATAL opened a school to train IDF Casualty Notification Officers in collaboration with the Ministry of Defense and the IDF. The program is designed to train Officers from around Israel as well as Officers in charge of locating missing persons to help families that are coping with loss and bereavement. In October 2012 a new year has started at the school with 80 IDF Casualty Notification Officers taking part in the course.

The positive feedback we have received has encouraged the school to expand the course to a two-year program including more sectors of the Israeli Defense Forces.

Community Outreach Unit

Head of the Community Outreach Team: Dr. Rivkah Toval Mashiach
Unit Manager: Esti Friedrich

The professionals of NATAL's Community Outreach Unit go into the field and meet the people in their day-to-day environment. Their activities are carried out in populations and groups that are exposed to trauma or that have a high chance of such exposure. The team uses a systemic model developed by NATAL which includes: interventions at the individual, family, community and society level, primary prevention (assistance before trauma develops), secondary prevention (assistance in a situation where there are difficulties already) and tertiary (assistance to symptomatic populations).

The working principles of the model emphasize empowerment and strengthening natural resiliency, strengthening coping abilities and growth in crisis situations, and integrating body and mind. Interventions are applied via treatment, professional workshops, training, team building and group facilitation, building emergency teams and community resilience.

The Unit's goals

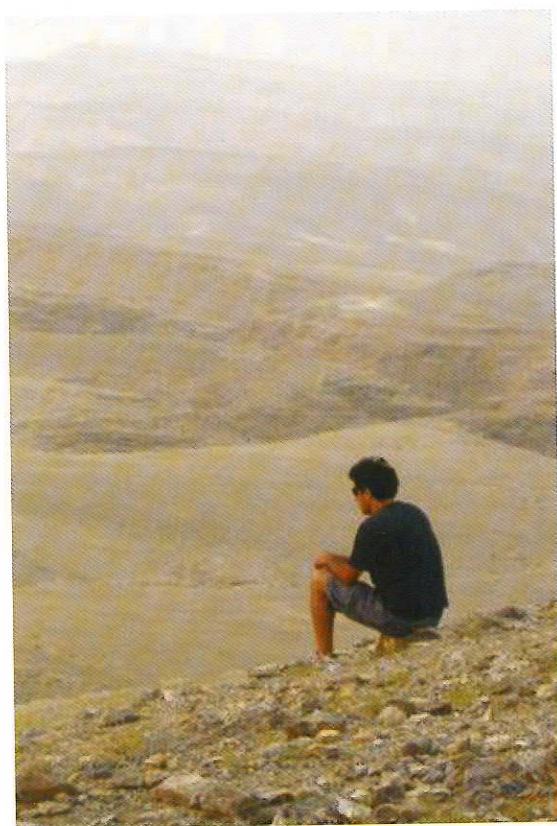
- * Providing emergency response to at-risk groups during and after emergencies;
- * Improving skills to professionals in the field;
- * Strengthening the coping capacity of populations, workers and organizations including government and security institutions;
- * Strengthening the resilience of educational staff, children and youth;
- * Developing and implementing emergency models for populations.

Summary of activities in 2012

- * In 2012 the Community Outreach Unit worked with community centers and resiliency centers in the South and North of Israel in collaboration with the Israel Trauma Coalition.
- * We are honored to work with "Mashabim" in implementing resiliency and empowerment training workshops to units of the Israeli Police Department. Training is provided through seminars and outdoor workshops in the field.
- * We created models for training medical personnel in hospitals and resiliency training workshops for the Israeli police and wrote training programs and

brochures on the subject of trauma and coping for the general population. We invested in providing guidelines and tools to teams of educational staff, kindergartens, welfare organizations, volunteer organizations and women's groups. Throughout the year we continued our work in Southern Israel.

- * This year NATAL appointed a Resiliency Coordinator in the city of Ofakim whose responsibility is to coordinate community volunteers with supervision from NATAL's experts. Some of the organizations she works with include the local Ministries of Welfare and Education, educational psychologists (SHAPACH), youth groups, orthodox Jews, women's groups and more.
- * This year we continued to collaborate with "Brothers for Life" by providing help to wounded former combat soldiers, and we provided activities for released former prisoners of war and their partners.

- * In March and October we provided emergency intervention and coping tools in the Eshkol and Ashkelon Beach areas. In November during Operation "Pillar of Defense" we were in Kiryat Malachi, Netivot, Ofakim, Merhavim, Sdot Negev and other areas under constant rocket fire.
- * We made home visits in areas under continuous rocket fire caring for children, parents and families suffering from trauma, we visited bomb shelters, as well as sending professional staff and volunteers into the field.
- * We worked with youth groups in English (MASA), French and Russian as well as provided assistance to factory workers in southern Israel. We gave workshops on getting back to normal life to girls doing their National Service in the South as well as to teams of teachers, parents, volunteers and more.
- * The Mobile Unit: Every week about six staff members visit the homes of residents in the south to provide them with free, individual, couple and family therapy in Hebrew and Russian. This year in addition to Sderot, Ofakim the town of Netivot is also receiving this service. This year more than 485 people have been treated, about 75% of them are children and teenagers
- * We have continued working in cooperation with Dalia Schatz "Mother of the Wounded". In collaboration we conducted a workshop in the desert, and did a three-day workshop with former captives and their spouses to empower and strengthen them as well as to work on personal issues, couple and family issues.
- * We worked in resiliency centers in southern residential towns (Hof Ashkelon, Eshkol, Netivot, Ofakim, BneiShimon, and Rahat) strengthening the coping skills of various populations including volunteers, retirees, the elderly, bus drivers, transportation guards, Russian speakers, women, parents and children with special needs, immigrants, etc. We also opened a unique project to empower women through yoga. All together we had 467 participants.

Data

- * Emergency intervention - Immediate emergency interventions during times of increased conflict were carried out mainly in Southern Israel. This year, 1,060 people received our services.
- * During and after Operation "Pillar of Defense" about 1,048 people participated in our activities.

Research Department

Head of Unit: Professor Mark Gelkopf

NATAL's research Department gathers information and provides research and evaluation services for all of NATAL's activities. The Research Department undertakes ongoing evaluation of the effectiveness of treatments and various interventions offered by NATAL to adults and children. Furthermore research studies are conducted to examine the influence of the ongoing state of conflict in Israel on the mental health and resiliency of various sectors in Israeli society. The aim of these studies is to further improve the organization's activities and to deepen our understanding of issues of national trauma in Israel. NATAL's Research Unit aims to provide high academic standards, the studies conducted at NATAL are regularly published in professional and academic literature.

Summary of 2012

The Research Department's activity in 2012 consisted of ongoing work with NATAL's various units, alongside work on special projects.

Collaboration with the Clinical Unit

There was continued evaluation of the effectiveness of current treatments, using questionnaires for patients and therapists.

The findings from the evaluation were presented at an internal conference for NATAL's mental health professionals. Furthermore, a model was developed to aid therapists to directly report the results of treatment with specific patients.

Collaboration with the Helpline

This year an article was completed with the help of the Helpline staff that analyzes data from years of extensive and intensive research on the effectiveness of the long-term adult Helpline therapy model. In addition the department developed a questionnaire designed to research the effectiveness of a long-term intervention model for parents and children, in order to complete a future article on the topic. Furthermore a project that assessed the therapy model of grief and bereavement was also completed.

Collaboration with the Community Outreach Unit

An article written by Professor Marc Gelkopf, Dr. Berger and Dr. Heinberg that concerns the school intervention projects in Sderot was published this year (2012) in the scientific Journal of Adolescent Health.

The Community Outreach staff assisted in assessing the work of the Mobile Unit. The department has improved the workshops provided by the Community Outreach Unit. This year there has been an emphasis on resiliency workshops provided to nurses in hospitals all across Israel and preliminary results were collected.

Collaboration with the Social Therapeutic Club

This year, in addition to the annual assessment that is made by the staff of the Social Therapeutic Club a questionnaire was developed especially for the club members for the first time. This questionnaire is designed to assess the satisfaction of the club members and the Club's activities. The assessment of the Social Therapeutic Club this year involves three groups: the two recently opened groups referred by the Ministry of Social Security, and the NATAL club.

Collaboration with the Resource Development Department

In 2012 comprehensive research reports about NATAL's activities were conducted for various different foundations in Israel and abroad.

Collaboration with the Testimonial Center

In January 2012 Prof. Gelkopf presented data from the Testimonial Center at a conference at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. The data presented included a comparison between preliminary data collected at the beginning of the testimonial process and data collected after its completion. In addition to the data presented at the conference the frequent assessment of the Testimonial project continued throughout the year. Furthermore the writing of an academic article about the project has begun this year.

Special projects

The Research Department has also engaged in numerous supplementary projects. Data from a research study on resiliency in Sderot and the periphery of Gaza that was conducted in previous years was presented in a conference at the Hebrew University and at a conference of the Ministry of Health on the subject of preparation and reaction to emergencies. Various articles on different topics were written such as assessing Post Trauma amongst people with disabilities and different aspects of trauma, resiliency and Post Traumatic growth in Israel.

Human Resources Department

Head of Unit: Sigal Adam

NATAL's Human Resources department serves to optimize productivity within the organization in order for NATAL to reach set objectives in the best way possible. NATAL's HR department determines policies and procedures of recruitment, code of ethics, and employee support and training at NATAL. It is of great importance for us to cater to the needs of each employee.

Summary of 2012 activities

The HR department assisted in the recruitment process of new employees, National Service volunteers and volunteers of NATAL's different units.

The HR department provided NATAL's professionals with training courses and seminars in order to gain tools that will help them improve NATAL's work.

HR Procedures: Several new procedures were introduced in various units in NATAL, including updated emergency procedures.

Motivational initiatives

- This year was the second year that NATAL's employees received Personal Coaching from students training at the Adler Institute.

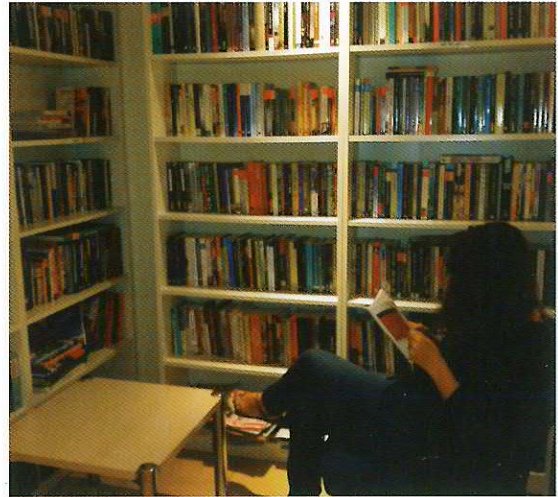
Employees received discounted tickets to popular shows and performances all across Israel.

Assisting units within NATAL

This year a library was created at the Social Therapeutic Club funded by private donors. Several activities were organized for members of the Social Therapeutic Club including tours and trips, lectures seminars and many more activities.

Volunteering

Volunteers are highly appreciated and an integral part of NATAL. In 2012, NATAL's units expanded their recruitment of volunteers, according to need. In total, in 2012 there were 220 volunteers in all of NATAL's departments combined. Furthermore, there are 80 volunteers at NATAL's Helpline, in case of emergencies throughout the year.

In 2012, NATAL's International Relations and Resource Development expanded their project with volunteers from around the world. The project entails raising awareness of NATAL's activities in their local communities, assisting in fundraising activities and public outreach efforts through social media. We are proud that as of today, we have over 45 Ambassadors of NATAL from all around the world.

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Public Outreach and Marketing Unit

Head of Unit: Gali Dagan

NATAL's Public Outreach Unit serve to educate the public about NATAL's activities while breaking the social stigma related to trauma in Israeli society. Through numerous media and general outreach campaigns, the Unit reaches out to all sectors of Israel's population to ensure that a public dialogue about the issue of trauma takes place while encouraging people to seek treatment at NATAL, if needed. We are very thankful to Shalmor, Avnon Amichay Y&R advertising agency for their ongoing support of our campaigns, done on a voluntary basis.

Summary of 2012

Media Campaigns

NATAL launches several major comprehensive media campaigns every year aiming to inform the public of PTSD and NATAL's services.

Radio

NATAL's Executive Director, Orly Gal, the Director of NATAL's Helpline, Sigal Haimov and other professionals from NATAL were interviewed by several national radio stations during times of emergency. In their interviews, they provided Israeli citizens with information about NATAL's services and Helpline number for immediate treatment.

TV

During operation "Pillar of Defense" there were several interviews of NATAL's Executive Director, Orly Gal and Chairperson and Founder, Judith Yovel Recanati on main Israeli TV stations. Furthermore, the head of NATAL's Testimonial Center, Judith Dor has also been interviewed regarding the testimonial process at NATAL.

Newspapers

This year we published the 13th edition of NATAL's annual magazine "About Feelings". This year's edition was titled "Trauma Touches Everyone". The main article featured actress Yael Abecassis from "Hatufim" and Iris Shai, the wife of Prisoner of War Hezi Shai. The magazine also included an interview with Meir Dagan, former head of the Mossad. "About Feelings" is released on Israeli Memorial Day to over 1 million households yearly. It is an important time for NATAL to reach out to all those who are experiencing reawakened trauma as a result of Memorial Day.

Events

In 2012 several events have taken place with the aim of raising awareness of trauma as a result of terror and war. Amongst them:

- * "60 Years of Trauma" conference to launch the research study conducted by Dr. Irit Keynan titled "Like a Hidden Wound";
- * The annual Golf Tournament at the Ga'ash golf club;
- * The Annual Women's Event.

Chain Store Fundraising

Several chain stores contributed to NATAL by allowing customers to donate towards NATAL's activities. Through these activities 370,000 NIS was raised in total in 2012.

Public outreach to students

- * In 2011 NATAL started a collaboration with Israeli veteran rock band "9 Lives" in a joint campaign to raise awareness of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) amongst discharged soldiers and the importance of early treatment of PTSD. To date, "9 Lives" have performed a series of concerts in academic institutions all across Israel to an overall

Campaigns Aimed at Children

In 2012 NATAL produced a therapeutic intervention puppet show for young children titled "Princess Kuntz and the Mirror of Miracles". The show, recognized by the Ministry of Education continues to be performed in pre-schools and primary schools throughout the country. It tells the story of a young princess's journey to overcome a mysterious spell and bring back the smile of the sun. The princess learns to cope with the fear, anger, and sadness she encounters as she

ultimately finds her inner strength and resiliency to complete her mission. Studies have shown that young children respond positively to visual enactments of psychological concepts, NATAL's therapists collaborated in the production of the show to ensure that the message was in accordance with NATAL's therapeutic approach. This is just one example of the many tools and resources NATAL uses in its efforts to combat the effects of trauma on children in Israel.



audience of over 10,000 students. Through their performances, "9 Lives" have increased awareness of trauma among their audiences many of whom have recently been discharged from the IDF and also suffer from symptoms of trauma. The concerts have helped in breaking the taboo associated with trauma as a result of terror and war, encouraging immediate treatment of PTSD by NATAL in order to avoid chronic symptoms;

- * A series of lectures by Israeli war journalist Itai Anghel have taken place in different Israeli academic institutions featuring movies that he made about his experiences. The purpose of the lectures was to raise awareness of the importance of treating PTSD and of NATAL's services.

Marketing campaign for NATAL's Multidisciplinary Trauma Studies Center

In 2012, NATAL's Public Outreach continued to focus on marketing NATAL's unique center for trauma studies via all media channels, specifically targeting academic institutions in the field of mental health.

International Relations and Resource Development Department

Head of Unit: Ifat Morad

NATAL's International Relations and Resource Development Department is in charge of raising funds and developing new strategies to financially sustain NATAL's activities. Our role also includes developing national and international partnerships with private donors, foundations, federations and companies, as well as with academic institutions in the field of war and terror-related trauma. We work closely with our "Friends of NATAL" affiliates in the USA, UK and Switzerland.

In light of the economic crisis that is happening around the world NATAL has taken upon the mission of increasing revenue sources by selling services in accordance with the goals of the organization. Workshops and resiliency training are amongst the services that NATAL have developed in recent years which are aimed at professionals in the field of mental health and other organizations.

Summary of activities in 2012

In 2012, there has been a strong focus on fundraising to expand our projects with veterans and children. We were able to recruit a number of private funds donated to specific treatments of veterans, support groups, and a campaign to raise awareness of PTSD among young veterans.

- * In addition to donations from Israel and our friends in the U.S., England and Switzerland, NATAL also receives generous support from donors in Finland, Canada, and Australia among others.
- * We have strengthened our relationship and cooperation with representatives of synagogues in U.S. communities that have "adopted" patients and funded their treatment at NATAL.
- * We launched a special campaign to cover the extra costs of the treatment needs because of the emergency during Operation Pillar of Defense.
- * Dozens of groups, government officials, organizations and federations visited NATAL's Center this year and we facilitated visits to communities that we work with.
- * This was our third year in which interns from around the world helped us in achieving our goals. Our interns represent NATAL and are ambassadors when they return to their home countries in the UK, Australia, U.S.A, South America and more. We are

proud to have such dedicated ambassadors all around the world.

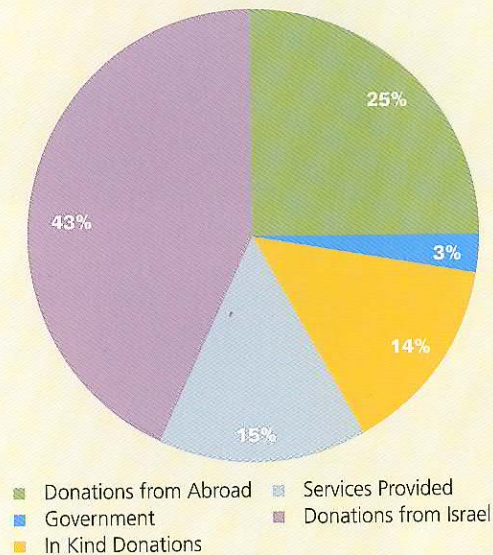
- * This year, we organized several events for NATAL's International Forum whose main purpose is to create awareness of NATAL's activities amongst the international community living in Israel and abroad.
